

THAR'S GOLD IN THEM THAR HILLS

For 15 years I had admired the shear rocky cliffs that rose above the Napa Valley. Powerful sentinels guarding natures finest. I had wondered what treasure might lie behind them that deserved these magnificent sentries. Shortly after moving on from my urban to rural lifestyle I found time to explore many points of interest. One of them was this magnificent rock formation. A two hour hike, from the highway and I was standing on a pinnacle of rock overlooking the beautiful northern Napa Valley. I turned and in the distance there appeared to be a treasure of gold. Being a cool and sunny day, in May, would make it an easy hike to satisfy my curiosity about these mounds of gold that seemed to glow in the sunlight. As I came closer the mounds became clumps of bright wax-like golden yellow flowers covering a mult-truck shrub from top to bottom. Less conspicuous were small dark green leaves with swallow indentations. I assumed this showy plant to be an exotic that had graced the

landscape of someone's hide-a-way cabin or campsite. However, after developing an interest in California native flora I discovered that it was a subspecies (napense) of the California Fremontia (Fremontodenron Californicum). It is indeed a native to the brushy well drained slopes of Napa, Lake and Yolo counties. Like the other two species and several sub-species it is evergreen. Although they produce an abundance of seed the seven Fremontias in my yard have never produced "volunteer" seedlings. I find it faster and more reliable to propagate plants from cuttings taken after spring blooming. These plants are deer resistant, drought tolerant and do well when planted in dry places with good drainage and full sun. The golden


flowers of the Fremontia are striking, especially when accompanied by one of the blue California lilacs (ceonothus).


Green Thumbs Up
