GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

NOVEMBER 18, 2014 CLTTGC

12:00-12:35 members enjoyed lunch & social time.

President: Marva Brandt opened the meeting at 12:35 PM by welcoming members, Mary Welsh & visitors. She thanked the hostesses Carol Dobusch, Heide Thomason, and Nancy Benkelman.

Parliamentarian: Ginny Cline, led us in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Co-Vice President: Susan Buckles introduced Kate Marianchild, author of the newly published Secrets of the Oak Woodlands: Plants and Animals Among California's Oaks (Heyday, 2014) who presented a program on the "Miraculous Manzanita". The book was made available for purchase during the meeting. Susan passed around a sign-up list to sign up on Marianchild's email list for future lectures & walks.

Penny Pines Chair: Joyce Porterfield started the flower roll call and Penny Pines collection. Presentation of a Penny Pines Certificate was made to Susan Buckles who has been a very active member since 2009.

Christmas Luncheon Chair: We will be having our Christmas luncheon on December 9 at Riviera Hills Restaurant and Lounge beginning at 12:00 P.M. Monies were collected during the meeting for the Luncheon. Carpooling is encouraged. Barbara Swanson can take two people. Susan Buckles will send directions to the Riviera restaurant. Members of the Ka-Ba-Tin Arrangers are asked to bring table arrangements to the luncheon. During the Luncheon donations will be collected for the Family Resource Center (Women's Shelter). With the donations, Suzanne Russell and Linda Waterstraat will purchase items from the Women's Shelter's long list of needed items instead of landscape plants. The Shelter does not have a water system in place.

Bench Update: Marva Brandt updated us on the purchase of the bench for Westside Park. The bench will cost \$625 plus \$250 freight, along with the Plaque costing \$180, totaling \$1055 plus tax of \$85. This amount would be over budget by \$139.40. If we wait for a later and cheaper freight date, it will cost \$100 less. Joyce Porterfield offered to pay any amount over \$1000 if it would help to facilitate an earlier delivery of the bench. After additional discussion, Leanne Harvey made the motion for the club to "pay anything over the budget to have the bench delivered earlier" rather than later. The motion was approved by the membership. Jerry Shaul volunteered to check other materials for the plaque – bronze vs aluminum.

Thank You: Marva thanked Jerry Shaul for his donation of a beautiful podium and microphone holder he hand-built for the club.

Mum Show: A "huge thank you" to Shirley for all of her

work. Thank you also to Heide for manning the kitchen and to all the volunteers who made this show a success. The arrangements were gorgeous. About 115 people attended. \$41 was collected in donations. Some quilt tickets were sold. Membership forms need to be made available during the event. There were several requests for plant sales. A recommendation for next year's show was to begin cuttings in the spring and have plants ready for sale during next year's show. Leanne reminded us that the plants would be too big.

Nominating Committee: In spite of contacting several members, Barbara Swanson has only been able to fill the secretarial position on the Executive Board for the 2015-2016 year. If a slate of officers cannot be presented by the February meeting, the Club will fold and cease to exist. Suggestions were made to: rotate positions; delegate responsibilities among the membership and for retiring officers to mentor new officers.

Announcements: Susan Buckles up-dated members about the upcoming field trips: November 20, Clearlake State Park Tree Walk has been cancelled due to staff shortage and locked gate at the Park; The November 24, Fort Bragg Botanical Gardens field trip has been cancelled. However, everyone is encouraged to visit on their own. Mushroom walks are scheduled every Monday throughout the month of December at the Gardens. December 7 will be the Gardens "Festival of Lights"... a wonderful event to see. Tuesday, December 2, there will be WREATH MAKING at Debra Watson's home. There will be a \$1 fee; bring about 12 bundles of greenery about 8-9 inches long and bow. In addition to the guest speaker, February's meeting will include making seed balls before the meeting as well as sharing seeds. A tour of the SF Botanical Gardens will be scheduled later during the year.

Daffodils: Jerry Shaul and a group of members planted 100 daffodil bulbs at the Ely Stage Stop. Linda Waterstraat donated a cute tea pot for someone to make an arrangement for the Daffodil Tea.

Membership Update: Susan Buckles reported that Michelle Wisler and her husband are recuperating from recent illnesses. It has been suggested that Club members could offer support by volunteering to deliver meals to them. Helen Turley noted the many members who volunteered. Susan will organize an on-line sign up schedule.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:35 pm.
