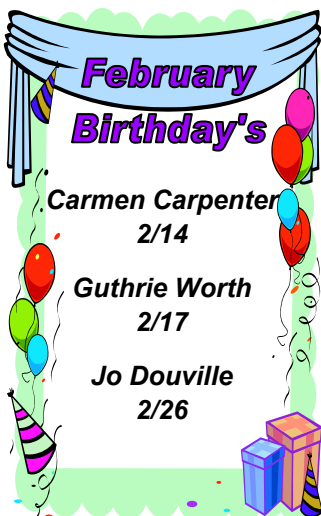

He was a widower and she was a widow. They had known each other for a number of years, having attended class reunions without fail. This year they made a foursome with two other singles.

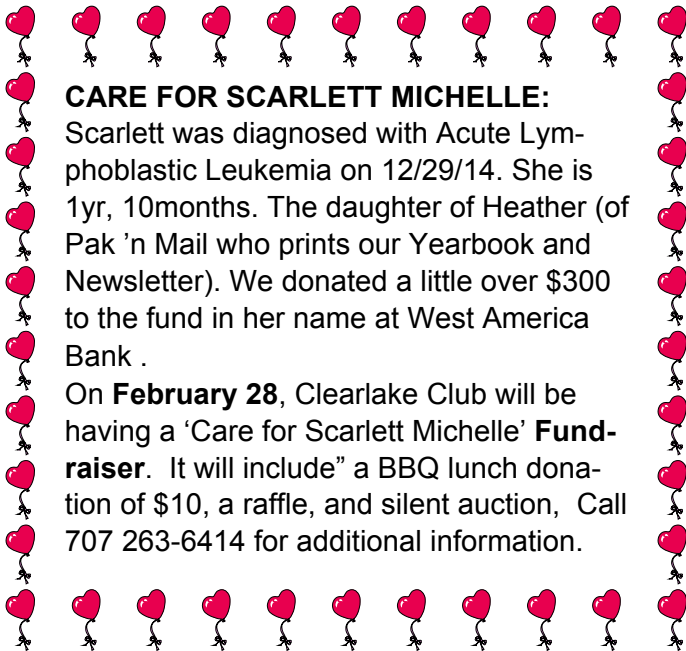

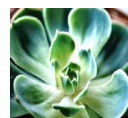

6 QUICK TRICKS TO DRESS UP PLAIN POTS

(unk author)

1. Go for glamour with metallic copper, gold, or silver spray paint. Let some of the clay color show through for an antique look.
2. Spray a group of pots with cheerful primary colors, or with lime green, cobalt blue, and hot pink or orange-red for a south of the Border look. Plant the same flowers in each pot so that the effect doesn't get too busy. White daisies are pretty in primary-color pots; deep yellow or orange marigolds are perfect for Tex-Mex designs.
3. Paint a pot white or pastel, and glue seashells around the rim. Fill with gray foliaged plants like dusty miller for a romantic, seaside effect.
4. Tie a bow of raffia or ribbon around a pot just below the rim, or rip a strip of calico and tie into a bow for a homespun look.
5. Cover a pot with plaster of Paris and stud it with broken bits of china, old buttons, or shards of mirrors and glass for a mosaic design.
6. Add stripes or polka dots to pots with bright paint as you would an Easter egg. Simple, primitive designs add childlike appeal.

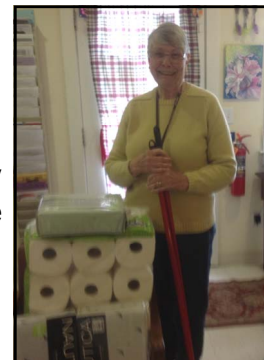
Save vegetable and flower seeds (and plants) for Irene D's Community Garden in Lucerne

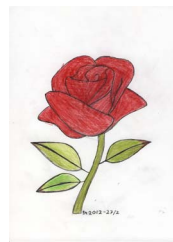
